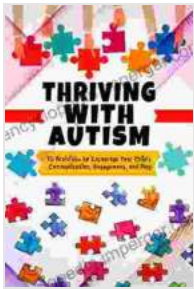

### **Activities to Encourage Play**

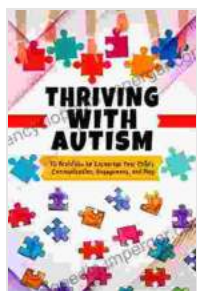
21. Let your child play freely and creatively.
